

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 74
OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has revised certain sections of the Illinois Vehicle Code, necessitating certain amendments to Chapter 74 of the Village Code of Ordinances.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE VILLAGE OF ROMEOVILLE, WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS; THAT:

SECTION 1: RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2: AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 74. All those provisions of all heretofore adopted Village ordinances previously codified within Chapter 74 of the Code of Ordinances shall be amended as hereinafter set forth, and codified within Chapter 74 as and for the sections so enumerated:

74.06(C) No property owner shall allow any unreasonable obstruction of a designated aisle or parking space specifically reserved for persons with disabilities after 24 hours following the conclusion of an adverse weather event.

74.06(D) No property owner shall allow the accumulation of debris or large objects, such as trash containers, to unreasonably obstruct any designated aisle or parking space specifically reserved for persons with disabilities without providing suitable and equivalent alternative parking spaces on-site.

74.06(E) Chapter 74.06(C) and Chapter 74.06(D) shall apply to both public and private property where any designated aisle or parking place is specifically reserved for persons with disabilities, by the posting of an official sign as designated under Section 11-301 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, as amended, and the applicable provisions of this Code of Ordinances.

74.06(F) A person who violates the provisions of Chapter 74.06(C) and Chapter 74.06(D) shall be guilty of a violation of this Code and pay a fine of not more than \$250.00.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY. That the various provisions of this Ordinance are to be considered severable and if any part or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: CONFLICTS. All prior Ordinances and Resolutions, or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency. .

SECTION 5: REPEALER. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.


SECTION 6: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by adding
Section 11-1301.8 as follows:

(625 ILCS 5/11-1301.8 new)

Sec. 11-1301.8. Obstruction of parking places for persons
with disabilities.

(a) No property owner shall allow any unreasonable
obstruction of a designated aisle or parking place specifically
reserved for persons with disabilities after 24 hours following
the conclusion of an adverse weather event.

(b) No property owner shall allow the accumulation of
debris or large objects, such as trash containers, to
unreasonably obstruct any designated aisle or parking place
specifically reserved for persons with disabilities without
providing suitable and equivalent alternative parking spaces
on-site.

(c) This Section shall apply to both public and private
property where any designated aisle or parking place
specifically reserved for persons with disabilities, by the
posting of an official sign as designated under Section 11-301
of this Code.

(d) A person who violates this Section shall be guilty of a
petty offense and pay a fine of not more than \$250.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January
1, 2011.
