Internships

Training

Grants are available to local businesses for employee training. This program is to assist in reducing training costs for current employees.

On-the-Job Training

The On-the-Job Training (OJT) reimburses the cost of training qualified new employees up to \$10,000. Businesses decide who to hire and how to train - then receives a reimbursement to offset that training cost.
