Our History

The Village of Romeoville is located in Will County along the Des Plaines River in the northeastern part of the State of Illinois.

The French geographer Louis Jolliet and the Jesuit missionary Father Jacques Marquette are thought to be the first non-Native American men to travel through the region in 1673. Large numbers of non-Native Americans did not arrive in the area until the late 1820's, when access to the Great Lakes Plains became easier due to the opening of the Erie Canal in New York.

In the early 1800's, Congress brought forward plans to construct the Illinois and Michigan Canal to facilitate greater non-Indian settlement. The plans called to connect Lake Michigan and the Illinois River. With President Andrew Jackson's Indian Removal Act of 1830, Native American villages along the canal were moved out and replaced with new towns and villages.

Our Namesake:

In 1835, the canal's board of commissioners laid out the town of "Romeo", its original name. Romeo was named in honor of the Shakespearean hero and was planned as a romantic twin city and rival for nearby "Juliet". Juliet's name was later changed to Joliet to honor the famous explorer Louis Jolliet and Romeo shortly followed by becoming Romeoville.

The Illinois and Michigan Canal was completed in 1848 and connected the Great Lakes to the Mississippi River along a well established Indian portage route. The 97-mile canal extended from the Chicago River near Lake Michigan, to the Illinois River in Peru, Illinois. It rapidly transformed Chicago from a small settlement to a critical transportation hub between the East and the developing Midwest.

The village's history dates back to the middle of the 19th Century. Romeo grew with its bustling stone quarry industry and was the "Stone City" before Joliet. Many fine examples of buildings constructed of Romeo limestone still exist, including the Illinois Capitol Building in Springfield.

On January 19, 1895 residents of Romeoville voted for incorporation. Two days later, Romeoville was officially proclaimed as a village. One month later, Louis Hamann was



elected the first President of the Village of Romeoville Board of Trustees.

The population of Romeoville in 1929 was 200 people with approximately 46 residences. Romeoville prided itself on having the Lockport Grain Elevator, three taverns and Romeo Beach within its corporate limits. Digging again occurred in Romeoville in the early 1930's when the Chicago Drainage Canal was deepened. The canal then became known as the Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal.

In 1957, Romeoville entered a new era in its history when over six hundred acres of farm land on the west bank of the Des Plaines River on Illinois Highway 66A, (now known as State Route 53), was annexed for the development of the Hampton Park subdivision. In 1964, another section of 446 acres of the subdivision was annexed to the contiguous area of the village. These annexations, in addition to other small parcels of annexed land, greatly increased the village's population. It increased from 197 residents in 1957 to 3,574 residents in 1960; to 6,358 residents in 1963; to over 15,000 in 1971.



The Village of Romeoville also experienced a very large period of growth in the 1990's. This growth in the population continues to bring a healthy and diverse mix of residential, commercial and industrial development welcomed by the village.

Romeoville, like many stops along Historic Route 66, is a vibrant, family-oriented community which proudly retains classic snapshots of the past. Today, Romeoville is a growing community of 40,000 residents and is easily accessible to new residents and visitors alike.

Notify Me

Once an account is created and users select the features they would like, the user will receive a notification when there is a change on the pages that were selected.

Alerts

Romeoville's Alert system is through a company called Everbridge. This system notifies you about emergency situations in addition to road closures and water main breaks via text messages, emails or phone calls. There will also be occasional reminders for some of Romeoville's larger community events.

You can choose your notification method: home phone, work phone, cell phone, text message, or email address. Because the system allows the village to send out messages based on a specific geographic area and because other communities in Will County are using the same system, you can choose to receive notifications for multiple addresses. Perhaps you'd like notifications that affect your home, your work, and where your parents live (as long as all three are in Will County).

Fire Department

The mission of the Romeoville Fire Department is to provide the best possible fire protection, emergency medical, and rescue services. We strive to remain prepared in the area of homeland security in order to protect and provide our services to our residents, those who pass through our community and for those who work within Romeoville. The following are services and programs offered by the Romeoville Fire Department:

Citizen's Fire Academy

Get an inside view of the Romeoville Fire Department by learning about the services offered, while increasing fire and safety awareness. The program is free and open to applicants 18 years of age or older. Academy topics include: fire behavior, fire service tools & equipment, EMS overview, auto extrication, CPR and a day in the training tower.

Juvenile Fire Setter Intervention Program

If you are having a problem with a child playing with matches or lighters and you cannot stop this behavior, this program may be able to help. An evaluation will be done to determine whether a child is just in need of additional important fire safety education or professional counseling which we can help obtain for you. All information is kept confidential.

Lockport Township Fire Protection District


The Lockport Township Fire Protection District provides emergency response for a portion of the Village of Romeoville (South of 135th and West of Weber Rd.) Fire prevention, public education, and other fire department special services are provided by the Romeoville Fire Department.

Safety Demonstrations

By appointment, a firefighter is available to present a fire safety talk to your organization. The demonstration can be customized to fit your needs.

Child Passenger Safety

By appointment, our trained and certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians will assist residents in the installation of child safety seats.

Romeoville Fire Academy

The village is very proud of the Romeoville Fire Academy, which was established in 2005. The academy trains firefighters in advanced skill areas such as hazardous materials, technical rescue, water rescue and other specialties. Academy students come from the Chicago suburbs, other states, and even other countries.

It is the largest municipally-operated fire academy in Illinois. The academy offers monthly CPR & first-aid courses to citizens, as well as "at-your-site" tailor-made courses to the business community, pre-schools, daycares, and medical offices. The academy also offers Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and Basic Operations Firefighter Academy courses for the general public who are interested in careers in the fire service. Smoke Alarms & Carbon Monoxide Alarm

As of January 2023, the updated law requires Illinois residents to replace their old smoke alarms with the type that has a long-term, 10-year sealed battery. This would apply to residents that are still using alarms with removable batteries or alarms that are not hardwired. Smoke alarms are required in every sleeping room and on every floor of a residence. Carbon monoxide alarms are required to be installed on every floor. The Fire Prevention Bureau can assist you with the installation and testing of your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Call (815) 372-4045 to schedule an appointment to have one the inspectors assist you.

Station Tours

To schedule a station tour for both kids and adults, call (815) 372-4045. You will see firsthand their equipment, station and some real life firefighters. They also provide tours for clubs and schools.

Parks & Recreation Department

The award winning Romeoville Recreation Department exists to provide quality recreational services to the community through a diversified selection of classes, programs, athletic leagues and community events for all age groups. From toddlers to senior citizens, every resident can find an activity or event that will suit their needs. It is the desire of the Recreation Department to continue to add to its already wide variety of leisure time activities that are offered to residents.

Recreation Center

The 55,000 square foot Recreation Center located at **900 W. Romeo Road** is the hub of Recreation Department activities and features two full-court gyms, various program and meeting rooms, preschool classrooms, a gymnastics area, an indoor playground, a senior/teen center and a fitness center.

The 3,000 square foot **Fit 4 Life Fitness Center** features state-of-the-art cardio and strength training equipment, locker rooms with showers and a beautiful aerial view of Village Park. A variety of membership packages are available, as well as personal training and group fitness.

Open gym, indoor walking and basketball courts are available every day of the week for certain age groups. Please contact the Recreation Department for hours as they may vary.

Your child will have an adventure to remember at the **Jungle Safari Indoor Playground** which also serves as a child care area for program and fitness center participants. Jungle passes are available for purchase or you can pay per visit.

Birthday parties are another feature of Recreation Center offerings. Parties are held in the Celebration or Art rooms. All party packages include admission for 12 children, a balloon decorated party room, pizza, drinks, and a surprise for each child. Choose from Jungle Safari, Gymnastics, Sports parties, NERF parties.

Romeoville Aquatic Center

The Romeoville Aquatic Center is located at 630 Townhall Drive. The nearly 22,000 square foot facility features over 11,000 square feet of indoor aquatic fun. Amenities include locker rooms with showers, 270 public lockers, two ADA family changing areas, and two multi-purpose party rooms. The indoor pool has a zero-depth entry, interactive play area, 42" deep activity pool, volleyball net, basketball hoops, a 20-foot tall, 150-foot-long illuminated water slide, a 3 lane, 20-yard lap pool, and current channel and vortex pool for leisure and exercise. Life jackets are available for use during your visit as well.



Police Department

It is the mission of the Romeoville Police Department to improve quality of life by safeguarding the lives and property of the people we serve in our community. By working in partnership with the community, we are committed to reducing the fear of crime, and preserving order through fair and impartial enforcement of laws, while at all times conducting ourselves with the highest ethical standards.

The following are services and programs offered by the Romeoville Police Department:

Anonymous Tip Line

The Romeoville Police Department's Anonymous Tip Line is (815) 886-8080 and is for residents who have information in regards to a crime. Do not use this phone number if you are requesting police assistance. Call 911 if you have an emergency or (815) 886-7219 if your call is not an emergency.

Crime Free Housing

The Village of Romeoville has enacted a Residential Rental Property Licensing and Crime Free Housing Ordinance. This ordinance establishes a crime prevention program designed to reduce crime, drugs, and gangs in residential rental units and which requires landlord accountability for criminal acts committed by tenants is in effect for Romeoville.

Additionally, to enhance the safety and quality of life in the neighborhoods, a Nuisance Abatement Ordinance has been adopted to control police calls for service at rental properties.



Prescription Drug Collection Program

The Village of Romeoville has joined many local law enforcement agencies by installing a prescription drug collection box to give residents the opportunity to properly and safely dispose of unwanted, unused and expired medicines. The prescription drug collection box is in the front lobby of the Romeoville Police Department, located at: 1050 W. Romeo Road.

Prohibited items include: Aerosol cans, Hydrogen peroxide, Illicit drugs, Inhalers, Liquid medication (prescription or over the counter), Needles, Over the counter ointments or lotions, Sharps or Thermometers.

Accepted Items:

- Medication for pets
- Over the counter oral medication
- Prescription ointments
- Prescription patches
- Sample medication
- Unneeded/unused prescription medication
- Vitamins

Police Department

Curfew

The curfew for any person under the age of 18 is 10:30 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 11:30 p.m. on Friday and Saturday.

Project Child Safe

The Romeoville Police Department, in conjunction with Operation Child Safe, gives away free gun locks to residents who request them. A waiver is signed by the resident. This program was adopted to reduce the number of children killed each year by accidental firearm discharges.

Youth Police Academy

This is a free one-week program held in June at the Romeoville Police Department. The academy was formed to provide a fun and educational view of police work while providing teenagers, ages 15-18 with an opportunity to explore career, leadership, life skills and character education.



Citizens Police Academy

The Citizens Police Academy educates the public on the mission, purpose and goals of the police department. Through classroom and hands on training, members of the public are taught basic police concepts and procedures. This free class meets once a week for 12 weeks.

Social Services

The Police Department offers no cost counseling to residents regarding marital issues, domestic violence, depression, drug abuse, anger management and parent/child relationships. We offer a full-time licensed clinical social worker on staff. All documented reports of domestic violence are followed up by this social worker from a social services perspective.



Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.)

D.A.R.E. teaches children basic decision making skills and how to effectively deal with peer pressure in order to make good life choices. This program is taught to 5th grade students attending Romeoville grade schools.

Traffic Education

The Police Department has four full-time officers assigned specifically to traffic related matters. In addition to handling motor vehicle accidents within the village, this unit also teaches classes at the Romeoville High School Driver's Education program. These classes focus on safe driving and teaches students about the dangers of drunk driving.

Going on Vacation?

The Police department offers a vacation check service for residents. During a resident's vacation, a police officer will check their home to make sure it remains secure. A form can be filled out at the police department or at www.romeoville.org prior to departure.

The Public Works Department is comprised of the following four divisions:

- Administration
- Fleet & Maintenance
- Operations
- Utilities

Mission Statement

The Village of Romeoville's Public Works Department strives to maintain and improve our public infrastructure in a fiscally responsible manner. Romeoville Public Works staff provide exemplary services to our residents, businesses and visitors to enhance their quality of life.

Hydrant Flushing

The Village of Romeoville flushes the fire hydrants in the spring. The purpose is to remove sediment and mineral deposits that settle on the bottom of water mains and to verify proper operation of hydrants. Discolored water can be drawn into homes or businesses if water is used during or immediately after area water mains are flushed. The discolored water results from naturally occurring minerals that will be dislodged during flushing. This mineralized water is not harmful to drink, but could cause laundry stains. If you have any concerns, call Public Works at (815) 886-1870.



Parkway Tree Program

The Village strives to maintain the character of its family-friendly neighborhoods. This can be achieved in part by establishing and maintaining a network of tree-lined residential streets.



This program is intended to assist residents who wish to have trees planted in the parkway in front of their homes where the trees do not currently exist or where the trees are in poor condition. Applications are accepted twice per year, first come/first serve basis, due in May and September each year. Permits are required for any tree removals or plantings within the parkway (right-of-way) of a property.

Current and Future Water Source


The Village's current water source is a system of shallow and deep wells that pump ground water that is treated and then distributed to our customers through over 280 miles of underground water mains. In



2024, the Grand Prairie Water Commission was officially formed that created a partnership with Romeoville and 5 neighboring communities to bring Treated Lake Michigan water to our communities by the year 2030. Water Meter Changeout Program

The Public Works Utilities Department is currently working on a system wide water meter changeout program to bring customers the most accurate and up to date water metering technology. The new SENSUS water meters being installed are read remotely each day and provide hourly water usage tracking to help identify water usage trends and determine if a home or business has a leak more efficiently. Watermain Replacement Plan

In an effort to reduce water loss as we work towards the switch to Lake Michigan Water in 2030, the Village has developed an on-going watermain replacement program to replace old aging water mains that are prone to breaking and leakage with new modern pipe materials that are less prone to corrosion or failure over time. Public Works Department

Each year the Village of Romeoville performs maintenance to repair its sidewalks through our Street Resurfacing Program, ADA Infrastructure Improvement Program, Sidewalk Repair Program and 50/50 Sidewalk Replacement Program.

Sidewalk Repair Program

The goal of the sidewalk repair program is to make sidewalks safe and accessible for all users. These repairs ensure pedestrian safety as well as reduce liability for property owners and the Village.

Applications for the sidewalk repair program will be accepted year-round. Construction begins in the Spring and continues to Fall. Village staff will then review these requests to determine if they qualify for repair program. All requests are handled on a first come/first serve basis and priority will be given based upon severity of the issue. Depending on the timeframe of the submittal/approval, the repairs may be scheduled for the following construction season.

To qualify for replacement under the Sidewalk Repair Program, one of more of the following criteria must be met:

- Vertical offset of $\frac{1}{4}$ " or more between sections of sidewalk
- Horizontal gaps or offsets more than $\frac{5}{8}$ " wide
- Spalling, holes, divots or deterioration more than $\frac{1}{2}$ " deep over 50% or more of the sidewalk square.

A field evaluation will be completed by staff of each application, if your request does not qualify for replacement under the criteria of this program, you could be considered for the 50/50 Sidewalk Replacement Program.



50/50 Sidewalk Replacement Program

If the replacement of the sidewalk requested does not meet the criteria set forth above, the homeowner can opt to participate in the 50/50 Sidewalk Replacement Program. The 50/50 program would consist of sidewalk locations that may have a crack without an offset or slight spalling that doesn't meet the requirement under Village's Sidewalk Repair Program. A field inspection would be performed for each application to determine the number of sections of sidewalk that would be replaced. After the site inspection, the homeowner would be provided with the cost associated with the replacement to determine if they were interested in participating in the program.

Water Billing

Automatic Bill Payment

Through participation in this program, the Village will automatically deduct payment of your Romeoville Utility Bill from your checking or savings account. You will continue to receive bills indicating your consumption, amount owed and the due date. Accounts are automatically deducted on the due date of your bill. You will never pay early or late. Your bank statement will show the date and amount of the automatic payment.

The Village's automatic payment program has three easy steps for enrollment:

- 1) Complete the authorization form, which is available on our website or at village hall.
- 2) Attach a voided check from your account.
- 3) Return the form and voided check to: Village of Romeoville, 1050 W. Romeo Road, Romeoville, IL 60446

Currency Exchange Payments

Residents also have the option of making payments at the Illinois Currency Exchange, 461 N. Weber Road, (815) 372-0113. Be aware that payments will be posted to your account within 24 to 48 hours and a service fee will be charged by the Currency Exchange.

Online Bill Payment / Automated Phone Payment

The Village of Romeoville now has a variety of options for you to pay water bills and also access your account information.

Make a payment by phone:

Make a quick payment over the phone with a credit/debit card or eCheck by calling 1-877-819-7080. Follow the prompts to make a payment.

Automatic Bill Pay: Through participation in this program the Village will automatically deduct payment of your water/sewer and refuse collection bill from your checking or savings account.

Online Payment Process:

Go to romeoville.org to log in and/or create an account. (You will need your Account Number and your full name as it appears on your bill.)

Opening or Closing Your Water Account

Residents who own their home may set up their water account by calling (815) 886-7212. Renters will need to come to village hall with a copy of their lease and a \$100.00 deposit. Any address within Romeoville village limits will also need a rental inspection with our Code Enforcement Department before the account can be opened. Village hall is open from 7 a.m.-4 p.m., Monday-Friday.

If you are moving and wish to close your water account, please call the Water Billing Department at (815) 886-7212 to arrange a final meter reading and provide a forwarding address. Please call at least two days in advance. The water account will remain in your name until the final read is obtained.

Refuse Discount Program

Property is only eligible for a refuse discount if the household will be vacant for a period equal to or greater than five weeks (35 days). The refuse discount will be prorated for the number of days away from the property. For additional information, call (815) 886-7212.

Water Bills

Water bills are issued on a monthly basis. Senior citizens (age 62 or over) who own a home are entitled to a 10% rate deduction for water on the first 8,000 gallons of usage and a discount on the garbage rate. Proof of age is required.

The Village of Romeoville Drop Box is located in front of Village Hall, located at 1050 W. Romeo Road. All payments put in the Village's drop box are retrieved by 8:00 a.m. Monday - Friday.

Things to Know

In addition to all the helpful information and resources in this packet, the following is more important information that residents need to know.

Electronic Recycling

As of May 1, 2019, the Village no longer offers electronic recycling at Public Works. However, Romeoville residents living in single family homes and townhouses can dispose of household materials like paint, motor oil, electronics & more. The "At Your Door Special Collection" program is carried out by Waste Management.

To dispose of home-generated special materials and to schedule a collection at your home, contact Waste Management in one of these two ways:

- Go to www.wmatyourdoor.com and fill out a request form.
- Call (800) 449-7587 during the hours of 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. CST Monday through Friday.



Waste Management will then send the resident a disposal bag to put the materials in and instructions on where to leave it for pickup. A list of acceptable materials for this program can be found at www.wmatyourdoor.com.

Dead or Sick Wild Animals on Your Property

T&C Trapping handles the capture of wild animals in the village and can be reached at (815) 467-4039. If you have a sick or injured animal on your property, call the Romeoville Police Department at (815) 886-7219, who will then reach out to Will County Animal Control.

Snowfall Parking Restrictions

Odd-Even parking will be in effect after 2 inches of snowfall. All parking restrictions will stay in effect until streets are cleared. A new day is considered to start after 6:00 a.m. These dates correspond to your address and the day of the month. Vehicles parked on streets designated as "parking prohibited" after 2 inches of snowfall will be ticketed and immediately towed.

Garbage Collection

- Each residence will be provided with a 96-gallon cart and senior citizens will receive a 64-gallon cart.
- Residential rubbish is collected once a week from the front curb of each residence.
- Yard waste must be put in biodegradable bags only and no bag may exceed 50 lbs.

If your pick-up date falls on a legal holiday, pick-up will be made on the following day (including Saturdays). The observed holidays are: Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

Items to be recycled include newspapers, glass bottles and jars, tin and aluminum cans, plastic and cardboard. Recycling bins will be picked up on your normal garbage day. In addition, Waste Management will pick up freezers, refrigerators, air conditioners, ranges, washers, dryers, microwaves, etc. There is no additional charge for this service, but you must contact Waste Management prior to putting out any large items. Yard Waste toters are available for rent by calling Waste Management at (800) 796-9696.

Things to Know

Romeoville Reinvestment Program

The Romeoville Reinvestment program is designed to provide financial incentives to encourage homeowners to reinvest in their property by making exterior improvements. Benefits of the program include improving the appearance of the neighborhood, increasing property values, and reduced costs to homeowners. Garage Sales

Any residential dwelling may have no more than two garage sales per calendar year. Each sale must not exceed three consecutive days. Normally the permit costs \$5.00, however the Village of Romeoville is waiving the permit fee at this time. Two community garage sales are held per year, one in the fall and one in the spring. Residents who participate do not have to obtain a permit.

Irrigation Systems

Village Ordinance requires that a permit be obtained for the installation of all irrigation systems. All underground irrigation systems are required to have a back flow device inspected annually. Inspection reports should be mailed to Public Works at 615 Anderson Drive, Romeoville, IL 60446 or fax to (815) 886-3596.

Solicitor Permits / No Solicitor Registry

Each organization must be registered with the Village and have a current permit before they begin a solicitation campaign. If you prefer not to be visited by solicitors at your residence, add your name and address to the No Solicitor Registry on our website.

Signs

Signs in right-of-ways, on trees or on telephone poles are prohibited. Banners, gas or air-filled balloons are permitted under specific guidelines and regulations. Banners and other temporary signs require a permit.

Watering Restrictions

Odd-Even water restrictions will be from 6:00 - 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 - 10:00 p.m. Odd-Even watering will be in effect from May 10th through September 10th. These dates correspond to your address and the day of the month.



Do I Need a License or Permit for That?

Residents need to know that licenses and permits are required for the following:

LICENSES

Animal Tags / Animal Control

All dogs and cats that are six months or older are required by the State of Illinois to have a rabies certificate which must be presented at village hall when applying for a dog or cat tag from the Village. Village fees for each animal tag is \$4.00. (\$2.00 for senior citizens.) The Village of Romeoville limits the number of pets in each household (see Chapter 90, Section 90.27 and 90.271 of the Village Ordinances for specifics on limitations).

Business License / Contractor License

All businesses and contractors operating within the Village of Romeoville, including home-based businesses, are required to obtain a license.

PERMITS

Block Parties

A block party application is required for any resident wishing to hold a block party. The block party rules, regulations and application can be found on our website.

Special Events

Larger events require a permit. The application can be found on our website.

Home Improvement/Building Permits

All residents are required to check with the Building Inspection Division at village hall for information on local and state codes prior to remodeling or construction of **any kind**. A list of registered contractors is available from the Community Development Dept. For information call (815) 886-7200 during the hours of 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m., Mon.-Fri.

Things to Know

Overland Drainage

Village ordinances prohibit any fence, berm or landscaping from altering the drainage of any property. Also, Illinois Drainage Law states that the flow of surface water cannot be obstructed and that the point of entry of surface water onto lower land cannot be changed. If you are uncertain to drainage areas along your property, please contact the Community Development Department at (815) 886-7200.

Siren Testing

Emergency sirens are tested the first Tuesday of each month at 10:00 a.m.

Mailbox Parking Ordinance

Cars may not park within 15 feet of an individual or cluster of mailboxes unless the car is registered to the same address as the mailbox in question.



This ordinance is in effect Monday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. This will not be enforced on postal holidays. Any questions should be directed to the Romeoville Police Department at (815) 886-7219.



Branch Pick-up Service

Waste Management provides a branch disposal service in conjunction with their yard waste program. Residents are already paying for this service as part of the residential disposal contract with Waste Management. This service is provided on the same day as your regular trash service.

- Branches will be picked up on the same day as your regular garbage service (April-Dec.)
- All yard waste and branches must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on collection days, in accordance with regular trash regulations.
- Brush and branches must measure three inches or less in diameter.
- All branches must be cut into four foot lengths or less and bundled with string or twine. The bundle total weight should be 50 pounds or less.
- Chipper service is only available following what the village deems a major storm event.
- Chipper service is only available during the two Clean Up Weeks per year: once in the fall and once in the spring following what the village deems a major storm event.
- Seniors in need of financial assistance for tree removal should apply for funds through the Good Neighbor Fund in order to hire a contractor.
- Residents are responsible for the disposal of any materials that do not conform to Waste Management's guidelines.
- Waste Management will not accept any limb in excess of three inches in diameter. If using a tree service for the removal of a tree, we recommend the contractor remove all the materials as well.

Keep Romeoville Beautiful

The Village of Romeoville is dedicated to providing services and programs to make Romeoville a safe and better place to live. We encourage our residents to take pride in our community to keep it beautiful. The following is information and programs to do just that.

Cooperative Community Gardens Program

Enjoy fresh vegetables but don't have a place to plant them? The Cooperative Community Gardens Program is a joint effort between Romeoville Parks & Recreation Department and Lockport Township Park District to offer plots for residents to grow healthy fruits and vegetables. This program serves both communities at Sunset Park, 729 Murphy Drive, Romeoville.

Residents can reserve a 10'x 10' plot for \$20 and an additional \$25 cash deposit. The growing season is from April 15 until October 28. For more information, call (815) 886-6222.

Exterior Structure in Disrepair

All homes shall be free of chipped paint and rusted fences. Home address numbers must be properly displayed.

Garbage Can Regulations

Garbage receptacles can be placed at the curb no sooner than 24 hours in advance of your scheduled pick-up. Garbage receptacles must be stored behind the front building line.

Graffiti

Help keep Romeoville beautiful and report any graffiti to the Police Department at (815) 886-7219. Romeoville prides itself on maintaining an aesthetically pleasing community and your assistance is needed. If you are a victim of graffiti, the Romeoville Police Department will assist you in removal.

Inoperative Vehicles

Inoperative vehicles may not be stored on residential property. Additionally, all vehicles on residential property must be properly licensed.

Open Burning

Open burning is prohibited except for the burning of aged logs in free standing outdoor fireplaces.

Yard Waste

All yard waste is picked up by Waste Management. Yard waste and branches will be picked up on the same day as your regular garbage. Place yard waste in Kraft paper bags bought at local retail stores or a yard waste toter provided by Waste Management. Small quantities of sod will be collected, provided it's placed in Kraft bags and each bag is only 1/3 full. Up to six bags will be accepted per week. All yard waste and branches must be placed at the curb in accordance with regular trash regulations. Mulching lawn mowers and compost piles are encouraged as an alternative to disposal of yard waste.

Line of Sight

This ordinance requires that the area between 3 feet and 10 feet above grade be kept clear in the area defined as the sight triangle. No structures, berms or shrubs taller than 3 feet and no trees with branches lower than 10 feet are allowed in the area.

Overgrown Lots

Grass or weeds cannot be taller than 6 inches in height.

Clean Up Weeks

Romeoville has two Clean Up Weeks per year: one in the Spring and one in the Fall. Residents are encouraged to clean up property keeping Romeoville beautiful! Garbage pick-up will be on your regular scheduled day with unlimited pick-up of large items. All normal pick up regulations apply. Hazardous Waste is handled by Waste Management's At Your Door Program. Make sure any additional items outside of your toter are contained in either plastic bags or containers. Please do not include regular garbage with your grass clippings. (Clippings must be in Kraft-Biodegradable bags or an approved container.) Chipper service is available during the two Clean Up weeks per year following what the village deems a major storm event. Branches should not be bundled.

Trash, Debris and Other Materials

Residential property may not be used for open storage of vehicle parts, appliances, building materials, garbage, waste, trash or debris. It is the responsibility of the owner or occupant to keep the premises free from all such materials.

Vehicles Parked on Grass

No vehicles, boats, campers, trailers, etc. shall be parked on the grass. They must be parked on approved surface (pavement, asphalt).

Golden Age Club – The Romeoville Golden Age Club meets every Thursday at the Romeoville Recreation Center, 900 W. Romeo Rd. from 12-4 p.m. Seniors enjoy socializing over lunch, cards and bingo. Members must be 55 years young to join, and may do so by coming to any Thursday meeting.

- Nickel BINGO** – Every Monday and Tuesday from 10 a.m.-noon, bring your change and your friends to enjoy nickel BINGO! Must be 18 years or older to participate.
- Drop In Day** – Every Wednesday from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. residents and non-residents 50 and over can participate in different board games and socialize with friends.
- Senior Trips** – Each year, the Recreation Department, in conjunction with a profession travel and tour company, offers a variety of trips all over the world. Contact the Front Desk at (815) 886-6222 to learn more.

Senior Resources

The Village of Romeoville is committed to providing the best possible service to our senior citizens. Below is information on a variety of programs and services which may be of interest to you or your family member.

Police Department Programs

- **Senior/Special Needs Registry** – Residents who are seniors or who have special medical needs (important medications, medical devices, or other requirements) are encouraged to fill out the registry form at romeoville.org. This form will be submitted directly to the Romeoville Fire and Police Departments so that emergency responders will know ahead of time about any special circumstances that may be encountered when responding to a call at your home. This database may also be used in the event of emergencies like power outages and weather related occurrences. The information will remain confidential.
- **Senior Fraud Prevention Seminar** – This program identifies the dangers of con games, scams and identity theft.
- **Home Security Survey** – This program makes recommendations to improve your safety.
- **Well Being Checks** – Relatives can contact the Police Dept. to have an officer check a senior's well being.
- **Social Service Unit** – The Police Social Worker assists seniors with personal and family problems.



Fire Department Programs

- **Blood Pressure Checks** – The last Thursday of every month, the Romeoville Fire Department attends the Golden Age Club at the Recreation Department, to offer free blood pressure checks to all who attend. Any resident can stop at any fire station to have their blood pressure checked.
- **Residential Rapid Entry Key Box** – This program is available to disabled or senior residents that may find it difficult to get to the door in the event of an emergency. The key box is designed to provide responding emergency personal immediate access to a residence. The key box is heavy-duty steel box installed over the top of a resident's entry door, with the key to the door secured inside the box. The Romeoville Fire Department has the only key to retrieve the entry key inside the box. To request a loaner entry box, please contact the Fire Prevention Bureau at (815) 372-4045. A release of 9-1-1 information and loaner key box form will be provided to the applicant. The request will be evaluated and given based on severity of circumstances. Once approved, the Fire Prevention Bureau will assist with the install of the box. The program is designed for short-time use of approximately 6 months. After 6 months, the need will be reassessed by the fire department. The key box remains property of the Romeoville Fire Department.
- **File of Life** – This program is offered to residents to have vital medical history within arm's reach for first responders. The magnetic holder, conveniently placed on your home refrigerator, holds important medical history, medications and past surgeries. File of Life holders/pamphlets can be pick up at the Fire Prevention office at 1050 W. Romeo Rd.
