THE CHICAGO REGION'S MAYORS ELECT ROMEovILLE MAYOR JOHN NOAK AS THEIR NEXT CHAIR

Chicago, Illinois — The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus has announced that John D. Noak, Mayor of the Village of Romeoville, has been unanimously elected as the next Chair of its Executive Board.

The Caucus is a regional coalition representing 275 cities, towns, and villages across northeastern Illinois, working collaboratively on public policy issues that impact the entire region.

Mayor Noak brings a tremendous wealth of experience to his new role, having previously served as the organization's 2nd Vice Chair and Secretary. The Mayor additionally serves as the President of the Will County Governmental League and as a board member of both the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning and Pace.
