

## Construction UPDATES



Construction of the first Grand Prairie Water Commission (GPWC) project began in June near 84<sup>th</sup> Street and Kedvale Avenue on the southwest side of Chicago. This is where the Commission will receive Lake Michigan water from the City of Chicago. Work at this location includes a tunnel extension and low service pump station that will be owned by the City of Chicago, and a suction well and high service pump station that will be owned by the GPWC.

Right now, shafts are being drilled at each end of the tunnel extension. Excavation for the tunnel will begin in September and continue well into 2026. The construction of the tunnel extension is expected to be completed by the end of 2026. Suction well and pump station construction will continue at this location through late 2029.

## Community SPOTLIGHT

### JOLIET

Joliet continues to move forward with its comprehensive water main replacement program. A total of 17 water main replacement contracts were awarded in the Spring of 2025 and are now in construction across the City. Engineering for improvements needed to prepare the City's water system to receive Lake Michigan water in 2030 are also progressing. Improvements including the initial pumping station improvements, and additional water main and water storage tank improvements are expected to begin construction in Spring 2026.

Joliet continues to make use of low-interest state and federal funding sources for these projects. The Illinois EPA is making very low interest loan funds available to the City for much of its 2025 water main replacement work. At the same time, the City plans to close on a new loan through the US EPA's WIFIA loan program to support construction of the local improvements needed to receive and distribute Lake Michigan water. This new loan will supplement previous loans provided to the City by US EPA and help to control the impact of new projects on customers' water rates.

## Conservation CORNER

While doing Fall clean-up, keep these tips in mind:



**Sweep your sidewalks and driveways instead of using the hose.**



**Be sure to clear leaves and debris from sewer grates so storm water can drain.**



**Disconnect garden hoses and turn off/drain irrigation systems until Spring.**
