

What is the goal for the project?

The primary goal is to improve safety, enhance the condition of the pavement, and connect regional bike trails along 135th Street. The upgrades include resurfacing of the existing pavement from 600' east of Weber Road to IL RT 53; including removal and replacement of deteriorated/noncompliant sidewalk/curb & gutter.



How will my property be affected by the improvement?

No buildings, relocations or additional ROW is anticipated. Deteriorated or noncompliant sidewalk/curb & gutter will be removed and replaced at various locations, as determined by the Village. Any sidewalk/curb & gutter replaced adjacent to residential driveways may result in driveway repairs (example: 2' x driveway width). The existing condition of driveways and any damage caused during construction will ultimately determine driveway repairs.


How will my property be affected by the construction?

Access to all properties will be maintained throughout construction, including access for emergency vehicles. One lane might be closed on either or both sides during construction at different segments of 135th Street. No detours will be necessary. Traffic might experience delays during construction hours due to construction vehicles onsite. Residents between Belmont Drive and Macon Avenue will temporarily not have access to on-street parking during concrete repairs and pavement resurfacing. These residents will be advised to park in their driveways or on adjacent streets.



How are the improvements funded?

The Village has received programming for \$2,696,500 in Federal Funds through the Will County Governmental League STP Program – which is 80% of the anticipated construction cost.



When will construction start?

The start of construction is anticipated in the Spring of 2023. It is anticipated that IDOT will approve the current Phase I Study this spring, and that Phase II Engineering, which includes the preparation of plans, will begin fall of 2021.
